The President Abraham Lincoln Funeral Experience

On April 14th 1865, President Abraham Lincoln was shot while attending a performance at Ford's Theater in Washington D.C. dying at 7:22am the following day.

The first public viewing of Lincoln was held in the White House on 4/18/1865 following the funeral on 4/19/1865, the coffin was transported to the Capital for another public viewing. It was decided that Lincoln should be returned to his home in Springfield for burial.

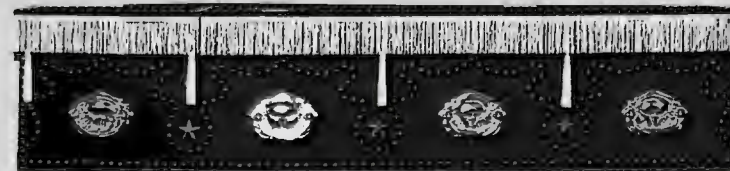


Large funeral processions were held at each major stop along the funeral route as the coffin was transported from the train to the place of public viewing. President Lincoln was the first public figure to be embalmed and viewed for almost three weeks.

Mourners were able to see the late president for twenty days and embalming made it possible.

Abraham Lincoln's death triggered the beginning of modern day funeral service and this exhibit aims to remind the community of our evolving perceptions with regard to death care and funerals.
