There is nothing like a visit to a cemetery to make you feel close to an ancestor. You are walking the very ground where they were buried and where they may have walked once long ago and visited loved ones. Tombstones can be plain or they can be decorated with art and symbols and wording that have meaning you might not fully appreciate.

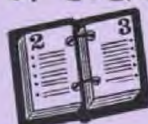

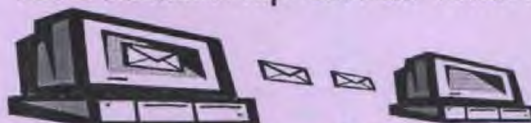

A new computer with a CD burner will arrive soon. The Gage FHC has the database OneGreatFamily to use for free. In addition, the Gage FHC now has World Place Advisor. This software will automatically check your genealogy database for place name typos, missing and incorrect counties, and other inaccuracies. Then you can copy and paste corrections to your genealogy file. (In PAF this is easy with the global search & replace feature.) World Place Advisor will find over 3.3-million place names from around the world plus US churches and cemeteries. Longitude and latitude references are also provided for quick location on a map. In addition, you can get distances between places. Future updates will include historical place names as well. (This feature is also included in Animap, which is available at both the Richland & the Gage FHCs.) With the Geo-Tree view you can see who lived where, so you can quickly and easily find which ancestors lived in what country, state/province, county or town, which may suggest possible relationships between people. If you want to check out your genealogical data base with World Place Advisor stop by the Gage FHC with a copy of your gedcom or a PAF backup.
