# CUTBACKS AT NATIONAL ARCHIVES

Federal budget cutbacks have impacted the National archives causing a reduction in weekend and evening hours of operation at both the NARA in D.C. as well as at the regional offices and presidential libraries. In addition, there is a hiring freeze, offers of early retirement buyouts and some preservation and digitizing projects have been put on hold.

The National Archives will be open Mon. thru Fri., 9am to 5pm, with extended hours only one Thursday and Friday evening and one Saturday per month.

For every title list in WorldCat, one can find which libraries in the network own it."


