FAMILY HISTORY CENTERS ADD FREE WEBSITES

Agreements with several new genealogy companies have brought new content to our local family history centers. While many of us were disappointed when the agreement between the LDS Church and Ancestry.com broke down, as is often the case, when one door closes another opens.

World Vital Records.com – This website offers both a U.S. Collection and World Collection. Some of the databases available include: SmallTownPapers, British Origins, Everton Publishers, NewspaperARCHIVE, FindAGrave and Quintin Publications. In addition, this website includes FamilyLink.com which provides space for you to upload your gedcoms, photos, stories and documents and We're Related, a family-based application on Facebook.com. New databases are added daily.

Footnote.com – offers digitized images of naturalization, military and historical; you can easily annotate the documents you find to help others learn more about the individuals found in these documents. You can even upload your own images and stories. Partners include NARA, FamilySearch, Allen County Public Library and others. New databases are added daily.

Godfrey Memorial Library – Access to Paper of Record, NewspaperArchives, American Genealogical Biographical Index, and more.



Until the design of New FamilySearch is extended to include Record Search, the results of previous indexing projects is available temporarily at

<u>labs.familysearch.org</u>. Click on Records Search and then on Register to use Record Search. It may take a business day or two before your account becomes active.

Some indexed databases have associated images (like the censuses you helped index) and some do not (like the Social Security Death Index).

Other records have been photographed (digitized) and the images placed online. These collections have been divided into small groups of images that can be browsed to find desired records (speaking in the genealogical sense, not the database sense).

Collections (databases) may not be complete. Click on the name of the collection. The description page indicates incomplete ("early access") collections. For example, currently 98% of the 1900 United States Census index is available. All that is lacking are the Armed Forces and the Indian Territory indexes.



The Ghost of Bobby Dunbar

Recently while listening to The Genealogy Guys podcast, a story was discussed that appeared on NPR radio's This American Life.

The story was so fascinating, I finally downloaded it to my mp3 player.

The woman who did the research to discover the truth about the kidnapping of Bobby Dunbar, her grandfather, realized far more about her living family members by learning of her past than she could have ever imagined.

In 1912 a four year-old boy named Bobby Dunbar went missing in a swamp in Louisiana. Eight months later, he was found in the hands of a wandering handyman in Mississippi. In 2004, his granddaughter discovered a secret beneath the legend of her grandfather's kidnapping, a secret whose revelation would divide her own family, bring redemption to another, and become the answer to a third family's century-old prayer.

To listen to this fascinating tale, proving once again that truth is stranger than fiction, google: This American Life Bobby Dunbar. This is a case study with a most unusual ending.
