2010 Census Cautions

As genealogists, we all love our Census. Many of us are actually excited to have a Census Bureau worker ask us questions and we daydream about what information our descendants will find fascinating. With identity theft being a new concern, however, caution is advised. Dale Denham sent in an email providing DOs and DO NOTs when dealing with Census Bureau workers.

DO - ask to see their identification and their badge before answering any questions.

DO - advise children to never engage a Census Bureau canvasser in discussions. Children, even teenagers, do not look at the same concerns or potential threats as adults and are easily manipulated. Census Bureau personnel should not engage anyone but the adult in the home.

DO NOT - give your Social Security Number. The Census Bureau will not ask for your Social Security Number, bank account, or credit card numbers, nor will employees solicit donations.

DO NOT - give credit card or banking information to anyone.

DO NOT - answer anything about your financial situation.

DO NOT - respond to inquiries from anyone associated with any organization that says they are representing the Census Bureau.

DO NOT - respond to emails that claim to be from the Census Bureau. Eventually, Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail, or in person at home. However, the Census Bureau WILL NOT contact you by email, so be on the lookout for email scams impersonating the Census Bureau.

Use caution and DO NOT hesitate to contact the local Police Department or the Census Bureau before you cooperate.

More Census Information

As genealogists, we always want more and more census information. They provide us statistics and personal information about our ancestors and their lives. The US Census Population Schedules are released 72 years after the data has been collected, but statistics from many censuses are available earlier – much earlier. Here are just a few highlights available at www.census.gov suggested by Janis Littlefield.

- "Through the Decades" find information on the questionnaires used for each census.
- "Teaching Resources" statistical atlases including those for 1870, 1880 and 1890. Also hidden in this page is a link to the "Census Atlas of the United States" which was produced in the 1920s.
- "Measuring America: The Decennial Censuses from 1790 to 2000" which is a large PDF file that contains all the questionnaires and instructions.
- "1930 Census" link and several maps of how the US has changed from 1930 to 2000. Every wonder why your recent family moved? Check this out for possible answers.
- And much more. A site worth spending some time exploring.

Some of these titles are embedded under other links, so you may have to hunt around a little for them. You will not be disappointed with the wealth of information available and will find much of it extremely interesting.


