

Preserve the Pensions

The Federation of Genealogical Societies, the National Archives, and the genealogical community have started a project to digitize the War of 1812 pension files—a fitting beginning to the bicentennial commemoration of this important war. Many know how information-rich military pension files can be, with comrades and family members providing service, family and personal data. This initiative seeks to raise \$3.7 million. Preserve the Pensions! seeks to raise the bulk of the funds before the bicentennial of the start of the war and finish digitization before the

bicentennial of the war's end in 2015. With 7.2 million images in 180,000 files, there is much digitization to do.

A \$25 donation will digitize 50 images -- a \$500 donation will digitize 1,000 images!

Salt Lake City Family History Library trip 2012

In the spring of each year the Tri-City Genealogical Society takes its annual trip to the Family History Library (FHL) in Salt Lake City. The trip in 2012 will be the Society's 32nd annual trip. This trip will be from Sunday, April 29 to Sunday, May 6 or any part thereof if you want to stay for only part of the week. Sundays will be the travel days since the FHL is only open Mondays through Saturday. Most people have flown down on Sunday afternoon and returned on the following Sunday morning. Some people have driven there and back.

So why make this trip with all the information on the Internet? Here is the description of the FHL, in their words, on Family Search:

• The collection includes over 2.4 million rolls of microfilmed genealogical records; 727,000 microfiche; 356,000 books, serials, and other formats; over 4,500 periodicals and 3,725 electronic resources.

Is all this information on the Internet? The FHL has been working to get some of it on the Family Search site but there is a tremendous amount of information that is not there and will not be there for many years. An example of the information that you can only get at the FHL or the local government agency is that on one of my trips I found the land records for my parents buying and selling land/homes in my home county in West Virginia and also records for some of my ancestors in Ohio. Instead of making long trips to West Virginia and Ohio I could look at the records in one location.

Next month I will talk about where we stay and what else there is to do in the area if you want to take a break from research or if you bring your nongenealogy inclined significant other.

Salt Lake City Family History Library Trip 2012

In my last e-mail I talked about why go to the Family History Library (FHL) in Salt Lake City, this time I will talk about where we stay and what el se there is to do in the



area.

We stay at the Carlton Hotel on 140 East South Temple a city block from Temple Square and a little over two city blocks from the Library. The Carlton provides shuttle to and from the airport. It also supplies shuttle service to the Library in the morning and from the Library in the evening.

Included with the room is breakfast, as they describe it "The Carlton's full-service made-to-order breakfast includes all of the favorites: ham, eggs, sausage, toast, pancakes, juice, coffee, fresh fruit, The Carlton Special Omelets, cereal, muffins and more." The group meets for this breakfast and mainly talks about their finds the day before or what they plan to do that day.

For lunch most people go to the cafeteria in the basement of the LDS main administration building. There numerous restaurants in the area to choose from if you don't want to eat lunch at the cafeteria. Dinner except for Monday is on your own.
