





Exclusive Scandinavian Records Online

- Danish records—MyHeritage has entered into an agreement with the National Archives of Denmark to digitize and index over 120 million records, including all available Danish census records from 1787-1930 and Parish records from 1646 to 1915. The entire 1930 Danish census (3.5 million records) is available online now. The remaining censuses and Parish records will be released during 2015 and 2016.
- •Swedish Household Examination Rolls, 1880-1920—The household examination rolls are the primary register of the Swedish church, listing the residents of each parish, their families, and important life events such as births, marriages and deaths. The collection includes 54 million records with 5 million color images of which 22 million records are already available online. The remaining records are scheduled to go online before the end of June 2015.

EVER HEARD OF CHANCERY RECORDS?

Not all courts judge cases the same. Chancery Courts handle such types of suits as divisions of estates, land disputes, divorce petitions, and business partnership issues.



Some courts decide cases based on written laws and there is no latitude for judicial interpretation since the legal requirements are defined quite clearly. Other courts, however, deal with issues of equity or fairness and these courts are called Chancery Courts (in Virginia and Tennessee, for example), Courts of Pleas and Quarter Sessions (in North Carolina, for example), or some other name or distinction. According to Black's Law Dictionary, justice in these courts is "administered according to fairness, as contrasted with strictly formulated rules of common law." So, codified law cannot decide these cases readily, and a judge must weigh all the elements and decide what a fair resolution is for the complainants and defendants. http://www.genealogyandfamilyhistory.com/whatare-chancery-records-and-why-should-i-use-them/

Lineage Societies and War of 1812 Pensions

When a person applies to join a lineage society, that application involves proving his/her direct ancestry back to the ancestor involved in a specific part of history. Groups such as the Colonial Dames, Mayflower Society, The Founders and Patriots of America, Sons of the American Revolution (SAR), National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), The General Society War of 1812, National Society U.S. Daughters War of 1812, and others all maintain this requirement for membership. They all have this in common—the lineages must prove to go through or to the War of 1812 generation, one of the more difficult generations to connect. The Preserve the Pensions Project to digitize and conserve the War of 1812 pension records at the National Archives is a key to researching in this time period. 50% has been raised! 

CATHOLIC PARISH REGISTER MICROFILMS OF IRELAND AVAILABLE ON-LINE FOR FREE!

The entire collection of Catholic parish register microfilms held by the National Library of Ireland is now available online, and for free. With this database, people with Irish Catholic ancestors will be to trace their roots back to the 1740's on a dedicated website free of charge. Over 370,000 digital images of the microfilm reels will be available for download. These parish register records are considered the single most important source of information on Irish family history prior to 1901 Census. The primarily baptismal and marriage records, date from the 1740s to the 1880s and encompass 1,086 parishes throughout more Ireland. For information, www.nli.ie. For more on the launch follow the hashtag #ancestorsonline or follow @NLIreland on Twitter. To use this site, one must know the parish or diocese where their ancestor lived. It is not possible to search the site for a particular individual or surname. The site includes a great, interactive map of the counties and dioceses of Ireland.
