


TCGS NEEDS YOU!

Did You Know?

- After 1914, U.S. passport applications were required to include a photograph.
- Naming traditions in the UK give the first son the name of the paternal grandfather, second son the name of the maternal grandfather, and the third son the name of the father.
- In DNA, more than 99% of the bases match in every single individual. The small variations, or mutations, are the things that help find ancestral matches.
- John Farmer, Jr. (1789-1838) is considered the founder of systematic genealogy in the U.S. He wrote the "Genealogical Register of the First Settlers of New England." His efforts also led to the creation of the New England Historical and Genealogical Society.
- 'Cohanim' is the highest Jewish caste, and is traditionally made up of high priests. The surnames Cohen, Katz and Kaplan are almost always Cohanim.
- Charting is usually recorded on two standard forms by genealogists—an Ancestor Chart and Family Group Sheet. Both charts are then sold by genealogy societies.
- There are several specialty libraries dedicated to genealogy, like the Family History Library in Utah, and the New England Historic Genealogical Society in Boston.

Ellis Island Tidbits

- A 15-year-old girl named Annie Moore from County Cork, Ireland, was the first person to pass through Ellis Island on the very first day of operation on 1 Jan 1892. She received a 10-dollar gold coin (today's value ±\$700). She was followed by 700 other immigrants on that first opening day.
- It is estimated that approximately half of all Americans have at least one ancestor who came through the Port of New York or Ellis Island.
- Immigrants at Ellis Island were given free meals upon arriving, which often meant their introduction to totally new foods such as bananas and ice cream.
- During its 50 years of operation, more than 3,500 immigrants died at Ellis Island and more than 350 babies were born.
- In 1907, the peak year of immigration, 3,000 to 5,000 newcomers a day were examined at Ellis Island as they tried to gain permanent residency in the United States.
- Immigrants often dressed in their best traditional clothes in order to make a good impression on the inspectors at Ellis Island, whose word had a profound effect which determined their future.

Griffith's Valuation, 1847-1864

Griffith's Valuation was the first full-scale valuation of property in Ireland. It was overseen by Sir Richard Griffith and is one of the most important surviving 19th century genealogical sources with ±1 million individuals who occupied property during that time. Griffith's Valuation, or Primary Valuation of Ireland, was executed to provide a basis for determining taxes. This involved establishing the value of all privately held lands and buildings in both rural and urban areas in order to figure a rental rate for each unit of property. The resulting survey was arranged by barony and civil parish, with an index to townlands appearing in each volume. The original volumes of the survey are held in the National Archives in Dublin, and Public Record Office in Belfast. Griffith's Valuation is an invaluable reference for family historians with ancestors in Ireland in part because no census material from the 19th century has survived. In effect, because it is the only detailed guide to where in Ireland people lived in the mid-19th century and what property they owned or leased, it serves as a census substitute for the years before, during, and after the Great Famine. It is also a valuable record of social and economic data and includes map reference numbers that can help researchers identify and perhaps locate property on Ordinance Survey maps created before the valuations took place. Because a surname could be transcribed a number of different ways, you should search for your ancestors under more than one spelling. Names with the prefix "Mc" or "Mac" should also be searched in the same manner. An Irish surname may also change over time and from generation to generation. For this reason, if you were searching for the surname "Donald," you would want to search under "O'Donald," "McDonald," "MacDonald," "M'Donald," etc. This is particularly important if your Irish ancestors later lived in the United States because in some cases surname prefixes were dropped at the time of immigration.

Aviation Family Tree

Delta is an airline, but it also has a family tree—an aviation family tree. The Delta Family includes more than 40 affiliated airlines and 94 years of aviation history. Delta operates over 5,400 flights daily and serves an extensive domestic and international network including 319 destinations in 54 countries on six continents. Its history can first be traced to a crop dusting operation called Huff-Daland Dusters, Inc., founded in 1924 in Macon, Georgia. This first true crop duster was designed to combat the boll weevil infestation of cotton crops. The company moved the next year to Monroe, Louisiana, and the crop dusting division remained in Monroe until crop dusting ended 1966. In 1928 the company was renamed Delta Air Services. Passenger services first began in 1929; however, predecessors of today's Delta (Western Airlines and Northwest Airlines) began flying passengers in 1926 and 1927, respectively. Delta moved its headquarters to Atlanta in 1941, and growth continued through the addition of routes and the acquisition of other airlines. Delta emerged from its 2007 bankruptcy through its merger with Northwest Airlines. In 2013. Delta was the world's largest airline in terms of scheduled passengers carried (120.6 million).



The triangle shape of Delta's logo, often called the widget, was taken from the Greek letter *delta*, and also recalls the airline's origins in the Mississippi Delta. It is also said to be reminiscent of the swept-wing design of the DC-8, which was Delta's first jet aircraft.

- 1953—Chicago and Southern Air Lines—brought Delta's first international routes to the Caribbean and Venezuela
- 8 Mar 1962—DC-8 was the first commercial plane to fly LA to Atlanta in less than 3 hours
- 1972—Northeast Airlines (Boston)—extended Delta's services from Canada to the Caribbean
- 2 Mar 1987—Transpacific service started in 1987
- 1987—Western Airlines—oldest continuously operating airline in the U.S. when it merged with Delta
- 1991—Pan Am—Delta acquired Pan Am's transatlantic and shuttle routes
- 2008—Northwest Airlines—carried the most customers across the Pacific and was a top cargo carrier in the U.S.
- 2011—Designated a Historic Aerospace Site, Delta's 1940s headquarters are the oldest surviving buildings of the Atlanta airport

Robert 'Bob' Foxcurran presents "The Canadiens and their Métis Descendants: Out West before the Americans." The French-speaking Canadien and Métis (pronounced may-TEES), who descended from the French and indigenous nations, developed a hybrid culture invigorated by their close kinship ties with the native peoples across the continent. Yet they kept their French songs and language, which effectively made French the lingua franca (Frankish tongue—a bridge language) of the American and Canadian West well into the 19th century.



2017-2018 School Year Ends

Did you know what the first compulsory education law in the American Colonies was called? It was passed in 1647 and was called "The Old Deluder Satan Law." The goal of the law was to prevent illiteracy and to prevent the abuse of power over a population ignorant of the Scriptures. It read in part, "It being one chief project of that old deluder, Satan, to keep men from the knowledge of the Scriptures ... It is therefore ordered that after the Lord hath increased the settlement to the number of fifty households, they shall appoint one within their town to teach all such children as shall resort to him, to read and write."

HOLLYWOOD HEROES THEN AND NOW

If you start a list of Hollywood actors who also served in the military during World War II, you can probably come up with a list of at least 100 names. The WWII list is so great, room isn't sufficient here to list all their names here, but it includes so many heroes like Audie Murphy-America's most decorated soldier, who became a Hollywood star as a result of his U.S. Army service from 1942-1945. He also received the Medal of Honor—our country's highest and most prestigious personal military decoration that is awarded to recognize U.S. military service members who distinguished themselves by acts of valor. At first the Army, Navy and Marine Corps all turned Murphy down for being underweight and underage, so with his sister's help, he falsified his birth date by a year and got accepted into the Army. He also served 6 years with the Texas Army National Guard as well as 3 years with the U.S. Army Reserves, where he attained the rank of Major. And then there's James Stewart, U.S. Army Air Corps bomber pilot who rose to the rank of General. You probably don't know the name of Bob Keeshan, but you'd probably recognize the name of 'Captain Kangaroo.' This Editor grew up in Eureka CA, but never knew the difference between the Seguoia and the Redwood until now! The giant Sequoia is among the largest life forms on Earth, growing as tall as 83 meters (272 feet). Just think, some of these majestic trees were already alive 1,000 years before the birth of Jesus! Did you know that the tree was first described by a German-speaking botanist born in the Austro-Hungarian Empire in 1804? Stephan Endlicher reportedly named the genus Sequoia but never explained why. The speculation offered by later writers was that he was inspired by the achievements of the American Cherokee Indian linguist Sequoyah. The trees that grow on northern California's foggy coast are commonly known as Redwoods, while those in the Sierra Nevada mountains are called Seguoias.
